TORRINGTON – Friday, Torrington Shrine Club donated \$25,000 – acquired over a substantial amount of time and collected with plenty of love – to the Shriners Hospitals for Children-Salt Lake City.

SHC-SLC Director of Development MJ Miller made the trip from Casper, where she was waiting to attend the annual Shrine Bowl, to accept the check at Cottonwood Country Club on behalf of the hospital.

Laramie Peak Shrine Club also donated \$500 to the facility.

The funds will go toward installing new lighting in the hospital operating rooms, Miller said. The lights currently in place are more than 20 years old and emit heat, cast shadows and are much dimmer than modern lighting.

"These checks are helping us with an incredibly important project," Miller said. "(This) will allow our doctors to provide the best possible care for the children by keeping our equipment updated."

Patient Told He Might Never Walk Is Now A Mailman

Shawn Skau enjoys his job as a postal carrier. He completes deliveries and gets the mail where it needs to go, even if it means spending hours each day walking from place to place. It might surprise you how much walking is involved. Skau said one time he tracked his steps and recorded 35 miles in just one workday.

Skau says he has trouble with his feet from time to time. But he doesn't let his feet get him down or stop him from doing what he wanted. For him it is all in the perspective. When he was a baby Skau's parents were told he might never walk, or at least not with a normal gait.

Skau, of Genoa, IL, was born with clubfoot, a condition where a baby's feet are twisted out of shape. It affected both of his tiny legs. A physician recommended taking the baby to Shriners Hospitals for Children - Chicago

for our pediatric orthopaedic expertise. "My first visit to Shriners Hospital was when I was 18 months old. As a child I had several surgeries at the Chicago Shriners Hospital to correct (my club feet)," Skau recalls. As he grew Skau went on to have more than 10 surgeries at the hospital.

You might think Skau would be glad to move on from a place that required so much from a young man facing surgery after surgery. But the former patient has fond memories and a love for Shriners Hospital. He quickly recalls the fun activities he played while a patient at the hospital such as wheelchair basketball and bumper pool. And he loved getting to know other boys dealing with orthopaedic medical conditions. "When I was home, in school, I was the boy who walked funny and couldn't run very well. When I was at Shriners Hospital, with those boys I

was just one of the guys," he said.

He spoke about Shriners Hospital often enough to make a big impact on his wife Shelly. Recently Shelly surprised her husband by bringing him back to the Chicago Shriners Hospital for a special tour. "I spent many months in that hospital (in your previous building) as a child. Just recently I celebrated my 50th birthday by touring the NEW hospital which is 34 years old." After the visit Skau was invited to give a talk about his experience to the Chicago hospital's Board of Governors.

"I never let my feet keep from doing what I wanted. For the last 22 years I have been working as a letter carrier for the United States Postal Service. Some days walking for 6 to 7 hours...Not too bad for someone who was told they would probably never walk."

Masonic Trivia

The portrait of which Mason has appeared on more US stamps than any other?

If you thought it was George Washington, you were wrong. The correct answer is De Witt Clinton.

Clinton was a US Senator from New York, Mayor of New York City and Governor of New York.

He was Grand Master of New York in 1806, Grand Priest of NY in 1816, and Grand Commander of NY Knights Templar in 1814. He was Governor of NY during the imbroglio of "The Morgan Affair." More important for stamp collectors, he was the Governor when the Erie Canal was completed in 1825.

A stamp designed for the 50th anniversary of the

canal in 1875 originally included Clinton's portrait, but wasn't used.


Three years later, the government needed to print a new taxpaid revenue stamp to be placed on every pack of cigarettes sold in the US. The oval portrait of Clinton fit the center design and a variation of that stamp was used on every pack of cigarettes from 1878 through June 30, 1959.

The three "R's" of membership development are recruitment – the successful creation of new members; retention – providing a program which keeps your current members active, engaged and involved; and restoration – restoring to active membership those members who have lost connection with the fraternity. These concepts are critical to the future success of our organizations.

As Shriners, we all have accountability to our fraternity. It becomes our responsibility to educate others about Shriners International, create more Shriners, recruit more Freemasons, and refer more patients to Shriners Hospitals for Children. Collaboration is essential, and we must all work together to promote successful and efficient membership processes.

Shriners International has developed a new approach to membership development, changing the membership paradigm with the introduction of a new referral program. With this new referral functionality, current nobles can now directly refer names of friends, family members and acquaintances who they feel would make good Shriners.

Similar to beashriner-now.com, this new referral program is administered through WebFez and links the prospect with his referring noble, promoting natural mem-



torship based on a pre-existing friendship or acquaintance. The new process can be tracked and reported, and each referral triggers automatic communications to the referrer and the prospect.

Once a noble makes a referral, he then receives tools and resources to mentor his prospect to creation or restoration. The program encourages constant collaboration, so that everyone can share their Shrine with the good men around them.

A recommended part of the new program is the encouragement to host fellowship parties and rush events. Fellowship parties should be in a relaxed environment and have an open table/social concept, with no formalized membership presentation.

These parties should be open to prospective members, but with no pressure for membership recruitment or restoration; and membership literature should be available upon request.

Rush events have an open house, social and educational concept, and are open to prospective members and their families. A multi-

faceted presentation providing information on Shriners, Masonry and affiliated organizations is encouraged at these events, including information about temple clubs and units. Membership literature should also be provided to all attendees.

Our goal for each Imperial Year is less suspensions, less demits and more affiliations. The leadership of Shriners International has added the lofty goal of 12,000 new Creations from Session to Session. This goal is attainable if temples focus on matching and surpassing their own best number of creations in the last five years.

There are many resources available to help us reach our membership goals. Using the new WebFez referral system is the perfect place to start, and beashriner-now.com is still a great resource.

There are also a lot of helpful tools on Shriners Village, including the Membership Toolkit, Roadmap to Membership Success, and Marketing Materials Ordering System. We also encourage everyone to work with their Regional Membership Director and the Office of Membership Development, and to send your temple membership team to the annual Membership Seminar for invaluable tips and information.

From the Recorder

Nobles, we again have three items of business that need to be addressed: the election of officers and the installation of those officers, along with the approval of the Shrine Center budget for calendar year 2018.

1. December 9th, 2017 Korein Shrine Divan Meeting will be held at 10:00 o'clock A.M. at the Shrine Temple in Rawlins. The Temple meeting will follow at 11:00 A.M.

The main business items are the election of officers for the upcoming year and approval of the 2018 Potentate's budget.

All Korein Nobles are invited to both the Divan and Temple meetings.

2. In accordance with Imperial Shrine by laws all the Nobles of Korein Shrine are hereby put on notice of the following provisions:

At the Imperial Session in July 2011 in Denver Article 25 was adopted by the voting delegates. This article deals with Officers and their election or appointment and § 325.11 Election Regulations was amended. In accordance with Imperial Shrine by laws all the Nobles of Korein Shrine are hereby put on notice of the following provisions:

§ 325.11 Election Regula-

tions.

(a) Electioneering.

A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, e-mail or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) Expenditures

Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) Violation

For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) Notice

at least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the Temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

3. This current edi-

tion of the Klarion which is mailed to every member of Korein Temple serves the purpose of the above notification requirement..

You undoubtedly noticed the dues renewal notices this year for two big reasons, i.e., they were sent much earlier than in the past and the notice that was included from me.

First, the early mailing. That was done by Tampa at the request of a lot of Shriners in order to avoid the end of year rush of both the Holiday Season and the various Masonic bodies we are all members of. Virtually ALL of those bodies demand payment by the end of December to stay current. This does not mean you have to have your dues paid any earlier. It merely gives you the option of doing so.

Second, my note that was included was supposed to go only to those who had not paid their 2017 dues. Unfortunately, everyone (me included) received it. I got to speak with or communicate via email with probably 50 or 60 very concerned Nobles who had their current dues card in hand when they called or wrote. But it also provided an avenue of communications for three family members who wrote or called to inform me the Noble of their family was too ill or infirm to continue membership and asked to resign. It was a shame to lose

Masonic Trivia

The first recorded occasion of a formal Freemason ceremony for the laying and dedication of a cornerstone was on August 2, 1738, in Edinburgh, Scotland, for a new Royal Infirmary.

Some of the 56,545 killed in Buchenwald concentration camp in Nazi Germany were men arrested for being Masons. Even behind the barbed wire, the emaciated survivors managed to conduct Masonic funeral services for fallen Brothers.

Four national leaders have been members of Federal Lodge #1 in DC, Presidents Teddy Roosevelt, Franklin Roosevelt, Andrew Jackson, and President William Potter Ross. Not familiar with Ross?? He was President and Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation in 1866 and again in 1874.

There must have been something about Masonry that attracted early American automotive manufacturers. Henry Ford, Walter Chrysler, Ranson Olds, George Mason of Nash-Rambler and John North Willys of JEEP were all members of the Craft.
