The Shrine Auditorium there was the location for the National FFA convention for many years. Girls were not allowed to be members back then but in later years the National FFA by-laws were changed and girls were allowed (that was a controversial but well-made decision). The FFA has benefited from allowing young women to participate.

My opportunity to attend the national convention was a memorable part of my high school years in as much as my Masonic and Shrine affiliation is now. The generous collection of gratuities for the FFA members makes me proud of our Masonic/Shrine families.

A Short History of the PNSA

The Pacific Northwest Shrine Association had its inception back in 1911 and 1912. In 1915 when Ellis Garretson, Past Potentate of Afifi Temple, and the Imperial Oriental Guide, conceived the idea that there would be much merit, by reason of their isolation, if the Pacific Northwest Temples would consolidate their interests in a solid front for the good of all causes that concerned their Temples of the Northwest area.

Fifteen Temples subscribed to this program and within a reasonable number of years it became apparent in National Shrine Circles that this block of Temples in the Northwest had become an important factor in the affairs of Shrine Nationally.

As time advanced and developments came into practice, especially in the matter of the high cost of sending uniformed bodies all over the nation to attend the National Sessions, it was wisely decreed among those interested that the wide prevailing distances between Temples in the Northwest, it would practical for these Temples to unite as an association with governing rules and regulation with a resolution of purpose to become a regional group of Temples for greater inter-fraternalizing, and hold annual sessions with Uniformed Bodies attending.

Therefore, On March 13, 1928, at Wenatchee, Washington, at a joint Ceremonial Session of Afifi and El Katif Temples, a special group meeting was called to order by Hugh M. Caldwell, Imperial Outer Guard, acting as temporary Chairman; and Bert Clausin, temporary Secretary. Purpose of meeting; To form a permanent Association of all Northwest Shrine Temples to, first, uphold and support the Imperial Council, second, to further and create interest and activities in this section of Shrinedom.

First Officers of the association, 1928, were:

Realizing the desirability of keeping Past potentates interested in Shrinedom in general and their own Temples in particular, President Edgar M. Densmore, Past Potentate, Afifi characterized his term in office, 1940, by injecting an added feature into welfare of the annual meeting of the Association.

Beginning in 1940 at Portland, Oregon there was established a special annual banquet held on the Friday evening prior to the Association Meeting and participated by the eligible; Past Potentates, Potentates, Chief Rabbans, Assistant Rabbans, Recorders and Representatives to the Imperial Council of the respective Association Temples. No ladies were invited to this Banquet as it was to be a time for Shriners to enjoy each other's company in a fraternal setting.

PROPOSAL TO AMEND KALIF SHRINE BYLAWS

(The following are changes to the Kalif by-laws to be voted on at April Stated Meeting)

This is a proposal to amend Article III Section 1, and Article XIII Section 2 of the Kalif Shrine Bylaws to bring them into conformity with our membership numbers and dues assessment.

Article III Section 1 of the Kalif Shrine Bylaws now reads:

"This temple shall hold stated hold stated meetings on the third Friday of each month, except June, July and August. The election of officers for Kalif Shriners shall be held on the third Friday of December each year, at Kalif Temple, Sheridan, Wyoming at 7:30 pm. At this time three representatives to the Imperial Session of Shriners International shall be elected"

This section shall be amended to read:

"This temple shall hold stated hold stated meetings on the third Friday of each month, except June, July and August. The election of officers for Kalif Shriners shall be held on the third Friday of December each year, at Kalif Temple, Sheridan, Wyoming at 7:30 pm. At this time two (2) representatives to the Imperial Session of Shriners International shall be elected.

ARTICLE XIII, Section 2 of the Kalif Shrine Bylaws reads:

"The annual dues shall be \$65.00 per annum, \$15.00 assessment for Imperial per capita and \$5.00 assessment for the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

This section shall be amended to read:

"The annual dues shall be \$65.00 per annum, \$30.00 assessment for Imperial per capita

And \$5.00 assessment for the Shriners Children's.

PROPOSAL FOR ADDITION TO KALIF BYLAWS

Proposed:

To add a new section (Section 9) to Article XI of the Kalif Bylaws to read:

Section 9

The Potentate shall, upon his election, appoint a House Committee to consist of 5-7 Kalif members in good standing. Said committee will perform the following duties:

- General inspection of the physical facility of the Temple
- Ensure that all proposed expenditures relating to the physical facility of the Temple (e.g. repairs, major maintenance projects, etc.) are reviewed to conform to the approved budget.
- Refer all such expenditures to the Temple Executive Committee prior to floor action by the Nobility
- Report their activities to the floor on a regular basis


